

## Updates from manufacturers/the world of tech

Many of the main manufacturers have launched new products this year, making the most of new research and development to improve the lives of those hard of hearing by integrating new features into hearing aids. Rechargeable hearing aids continue to be very popular. Some manufacturers have changed the shape of their devices to optimise directionality of the hearing aids to assist hearing in noise. Some are able to



detect the wearer's body movement and use this information to deduce what listening environment the person is in and further optimise the settings in the hearing aids for that setting. Bluetooth Low Energy (LE) is also being used in hearing aid technology and will increase over the next few years. Manufacturers are always trying to find ways to assist with speech understanding and reduce listening effort in various listening environments. Rechargeable aids are very popular but battery-operated aids are still available for many models.
